To promote a healthy lifestyle for all children	£0	Children to walk a mile daily	Target=Children in all year groups run or walk a mile daily. Legacy: improved fitness level and wellbeing amongst children. At end of 2017-2018, 28 % of children in reception were overweight or obese. The proportion of Year 6 children who were overweight or obese (46.7%) is higher in LGCS than in most other schools across England (34%). Target is to reduce this by a third in each year group.	All children completed walk a mile daily. Impact to be measured when next set of data arrives in school. This will remain in place for next year though. Teachers use walk a mile to talk to children and promote wider wellbeing as well as promoting the benefits of a healthy outdoor lifestyle.
